What Is the Oil and Gas Research Program?

North Dakota's OGRP, established by the Legislature in 2003, is a state–industry program designed to:

- Demonstrate to the general public the importance of the state's oil and gas exploration and production industry.
- Encourage and promote the wise and efficient use of energy.
- Promote environmentally sound exploration and production methods and technologies.
- Develop the state's oil and gas resources.
- Support research and educational activities concerning the oil and natural gas exploration and production industry.

The Program is funded from the state's share of the oil and gas production tax and oil extraction tax. Two percent of the state's share of the oil and gas gross production tax and oil extraction tax revenues, up to \$10 million, is available to the OGRP each biennium.

Mission Statement

The mission of the Oil and Gas Research Council (OGRC) is to promote the growth of the oil and gas industry through research and education.

OGRP Leadership

The OGRP is administered by the OGRC, a team of seven citizens appointed by the Governor of North Dakota, including the Executive Director of the North Dakota Petroleum Council (NDPC), plus two nonvoting members serving as advisors. The OGRC serves the North Dakota Industrial Commission (NDIC).

A Sampling of OGRP Projects

The OGRP has provided over \$20 million in funding for over 60 projects since its inception in 2003. The total value of the projects was over \$200 million, resulting in productive leveraging of state funds at a ratio of greater than 16:1. Each project selected by the OGRC for participation in the OGRP has the potential to positively impact the promotion of North Dakota oil and gas resources in environmentally responsible and economically beneficial ways.

Improved Directional Drilling Technology for the Bakken Formation	Laserlith Corporation	Increase efficiencies of horizontal drilling in the Bakken Formation through a redesign of drilling tools by including the use of miniature gyroscopes in the drilling assembly.	
Program to Determine the Uniqueness of Three Forks Bench Reserves, Determine Optimal Well Density in the Bakken Pool, and Optimize Bakken Production	Energy & Environmental Research Center and Continental Resources	Investigate new approaches to increase understanding of potential petroleum reserves in the Bakken–Three Forks system and decrease recovery costs in an environmentally sound manner.	
Vertical Seismic Profiling Test of Seismic Fault and Fracture Detection in the Bakken Formation	Marathon Oil Company	Acquire vertical seismic profile data from a Bakken well to enable correlation of seismic signature and proper time—depth relationships to understand the Bakken seismic acoustic nature better.	
Oil Can!	NDPC	Provide education and outreach to industry members, landowners, royalty owners, policymakers, and the general public.	
Commercial Drivers License Training Program	Train ND-Northwest, Williston State College	Purchase two simulators and a trailer for the simulators to allow commercial drivers license training to be delivered at various locations.	
Wellhead Gas Capture via CNG Technologies	Bakken Express, LLC	Evaluate the viability of applying compressed natural gas technologies to economically capture and transport produced natural gas and gas liquids to market.	
Education of Oilfield Fire Safety	North Dakota Association of Oil and Gas Producing Counties	Educate 3000 volunteer and staff firefighters in western and central North Dakota and other state officials about oilfield fire safety, and encourage them to learn more about oilfield fire safety by attending training at the Dickinson-based Williston Basin Oilfield Fire Training facility.
